During Helene and Milton our kitchen and pantry staff missed only one day of service in each storm. They did an incredible job in getting meals prepared, even without power! We had the generator which provided minimal lighting and gas for cooking. We are committed to helping those most needy in our community under all circumstances.

Our meal counts are up dramatically year to date as are the food pantry visits (see Coach's Notes). Our operating costs have increased proportionally. For example, food costs are up \$5,400 from last year and repairs and maintenance are up \$9,700. In addition, payroll, insurance and van expenses are up.

In May, Feeding Tampa Bay initiated a program to donate 6 box trucks to non-profits in their 10-county area. After applying for one we were initially rejected as a recipient. However, due to unforeseen circumstances, we were contacted in September and told that we would indeed be receiving one of the vehicles. We are most grateful for the donation and have applied funds that were donated specifically toward this purchase toward the additional upkeep and insurance that will be required.

As we move toward the 2024 Holiday Season, please keep Our Daily Bread in your hearts and prayers and consider a donation of your time and talents.

The recent back-to-back hurricanes have not only caused significant damage to our homes and communities but also to our mental and physical well-being. Please remember to take time for yourselves. "Within your temple, O God, we meditate on your unfailing love." — Psalm 48:9




COACHES NOTES

The numbers of meal served at the soup kitchen have increased 26% over the last 3 months, that is about 60 more clients each day. At the food pantry we served more in the first 9 months this year than all of 2023. Number of clients we served in the first 9 months, 2024 is 14,433 total for 2023, is 13,351. Our annual budget for the current year is 360,000.00 or over 1,000.00 dollars per day. But our actual cost is over budget because of equipment repairs and needed replacements, these have cost a total of 35,000.00 a big hit to our budget.

The agreement with Feeding Tampa Bay for the box truck includes picking up a pallet of milk each week at their warehouse in Tampa. The milk is a nice added item or the food pantry but the added cost of picking it up and handling that much milk is going to add several hundred dollars to our budget. We are hoping to get other foods and produce on the weekly trips.

You ask, how did Our Daily Bread do during the storm? Thank you for asking on, Wednesday we were open but only served 25 clients, Wednesday afternoon our power went out. Our Daily Bread was closed Thursday; we had no power and a leaking roof. On Friday Angie (Food Pantry) got in early to start the clean up and meal preparation. We suffered water damage on the ceiling tiles and floors. Outside we lost of awnings and lots of tree debris in our parking lot. The power was restored on Friday, and we served 215 clients. Saturday, we served over 300 clients. But for a 100-year storm we came out remarkably good. Britney (Loaves & Fishes) was open Monday the 14th. and several added days during the week after the storm to accommodate our community. We are Proud of our team. They all showed up and worked extremely hard. A big Thank You!



At the food pantry on Mondays and Fridays we have been seeing a new group of clients from the mobile parks in our area. With the increasing rents more people are having a tough time finding monies for food. If you are a resident in the mobile park who would like to help your neighbors, we would like to meet you to plan a delivery system to get food were it is most needed.
