Thank you to all the donors who were able to participate in the Giving Challenge. Once again, a big acknowledgement to the Community Foundation of Sarasota and the Patterson Foundation who collaborated to make it a huge success.

April 22nd was the start of National Volunteer Appreciation Week. We celebrated all of the amazing people who choose to spend their free time helping those most needy in Manatee County! Our volunteers helped us provide food security for over 100,000 of our clients with their 15,800 volunteer hours donated in 2023.

We have been very busy the first part of 2024 at Our Daily Bread. Our meal count was up 20% in March and Loaves & Fishes food pantry was up 40% over March of 2023. Related to the increase in our numbers is the need for more food. In the first quarter of 2024, our food purchases were up \$5,000.

We have had some critical equipment failures that started in the beginning of the year. We moved into our present location about 16 years ago and some of our equipment is showing its age. Our cooking kettle, which is used almost daily to prepare 175 – 200 meals, was going to need a repair costing \$6,000 so we started looking for a new one. Thankfully, Christ Church on Longboat Key came to our rescue with a new replacement. On top of that, our convection oven saw its last days of service in early April. The new one arrived on April 19th and is up and running. We are so fortunate to have so many donors who help us in our time of need.

COACHES NOTES

We started the year in the soup kitchen serving about the same number of meals served in January and February, then in March and April meal counts went up by 20%. We saw several new clients everyday, looks like it's going to be a busy summer.

At Loaves and Fishes, the client counts have been increasing every month, January 1545 clients up from last years 830 clients. February 1509 clients up from 795 clients. March 1583 clients up from 816 clients and in April 1697 clients, shoppers with family members of 3854. You ask, "how do we get this information?" Glad you asked, everyday when clients come into shop, they are required to sign-in, their names are checked with our data base to see when the shopped last, if over two weeks ago they are welcome to shop, when signing-in we ask, how many members are in your family, this information is totaled for our monthly reports. With 3854 family members served in April it would be a total of (3854x12) 46,246 for the year, that is all most half of the population in Bradenton. All in two mornings a week, by all indications it's going to be a busy summer.

The food, produce and meats we pick-up from 10 stores and the goods we receive from Feeding Tampa Bay and Meals on Wheels we handle over 2 million pounds of food each year. Our vans are on the road everyday picking up food items. The cost of running the vans is over \$1000 per month just for fuel, repairs and insurance.

All of our kitchen equipment was new when we moved in 16 years ago, in the last 6 months we've had to replace the hot serving cart, the large cooking skillet and the convection oven, we tried for weeks to repair them all to no avail, we had to replace them. We had one of our vans break down on the road and needed to have it towed in for repairs. The air conditioner compressor in the kitchen had to be replaced and we need a new faucet at the main sink. Thank God for all your Support! With the individual supporters, churches, foundations, trust and reserves available we were able to pay for all these repairs and replacements. Thank You!
